# Share in the Suffering

"To die is gain" may be the biggest selling point of belief in Jesus. I know this was true for me when I first embraced Christ. The moral compass and values that I gained were incredibly important, but it was the promise of receiving the "get-out-of-eternal-damnation card" upon death that I could not ignore. I was convinced this was the main reason why folks flocked to the front during altar call.

Philippians 1:21-30 hints at a different reality though. While dying is gain, we must remain in the body. This is because our salvation is rooted not only in deliverance from the ramifications of sin after death, but in the way we live our lives. As we approach International Day of Peace in a world that is growing increasingly violent, how do you share in the suffering that accompanies our belief in Christ? Are you faithful and courageous?


Dying is the easy part; Paul highlights this in today's scripture. The hard work is living intentionally to bring about a world that emulates Christ's peace, God's shalom. We mustn't shy away from this suffering, because to live faithfully and courageously is to live as the peacebuilders we are called to be.

Text for today: "Because for me, living serves Christ and dying is even better. If I continue to live in this world, I get results from my work. But I don't know what I prefer. I'm torn between the two because I want to leave this life and be with Christ, which is far better. However, it's more important for me to stay in this world for your sake. I'm sure of this: I will stay alive and remain with all of you to help your progress and the joy of your faith, and to increase your pride in Christ Jesus through my presence when I visit you again. Most important, live together in a manner worthy of Christ's gospel. Do this, whether I come and see you or I'm absent and hear about you. Do this so that you stand firm, united in one spirit and mind as you struggle together to remain faithful to the gospel. That way, you won't be afraid of anything your enemies do. Your faithfulness and courage are a sign of their coming destruction and your salvation, which is from God. God has generously granted you the privilege, not only of believing in Christ but also of suffering for Christ's sake. You are having the same struggle that you saw me face and now hear that I'm still facing" (Phil. 1:21-30, CEB).
