FAMILY GAME NIGHT



#### DISTRICT CONFERENCE 2020

The highlights of the 2020 District Conference which were voted on via mail was the adoption of a budget of \$385,978 which amounts to \$79/member (fair share), and election of Ray Lehman as 2021 Moderator and John Shelley as 2021 Moderator elect. The delegates also voted on accepting, with regrets, the withdrawal of four churches from our district: Pleasant View; Pleasant Hill; Falling Spring; and Bunkertown. It was a very different year with needing to "do conference" remotely. Thanks go out to John Hess who, very adeptly, negotiated us through this year of COVID-19. Thank you, John!
