You Are with Us

In spring, God's creation breathes. Grasses turn green, rains refresh the earth, and flowers and trees bud and blossom. The sun warms the soil as farmers prepare for planting. Robins build nests, and fawns are born in the forest. We anticipate these patterns.

Last year, however, was a year of uncertainty and change. The COVID-19 pandemic impacted governments, businesses, schools, healthcare systems, and churches, to name a few. People suffered with isolation, illness, death, and recovery. Multitudes experienced income, food, and housing insecurities. A derecho windstorm swept through seven states, flattening crops, trees, and buildings. Forest fires consumed millions of acres along the West Coast, blackening the air many inhaled. Hurricanes wreaked havoc with winds and rains. Our streets heard cries of injustice and racism.

If David were with us, would he say he lived in fear? In Psalm 23, he wrote: "Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me" (v. 4*a*). No, David lived without fear because God was with him.

We live in a world of beauty and chaos, of joy and sorrow, of hope and despair, of birth and death. How can we not be afraid? At any moment, our path can become unclear and we may feel lost and uncertain. In these times, remember that God watches over us just as he watches over the fawn in the forest. Do not fear.

Shepherd God, at times we feel the darkness closing in on us. Help us to be strong, for you are our strength and our shield. Lead us on the right paths, for you are our guide. When you are with us, we are not afraid. Guide us to do your will. Amen.


