This has been one of the most difficult years of my pastoral ministry with trying to "re-think" worship and how we will worship here at Hanover COB. I truly appreciate the help of the leadership team/board in making some of the decisions so that together we could move through the changes we needed to make. I also appreciate the help of Alan Bridenbaugh and Ben Warfield who record the services and get them posted on our "home page."

I want to thank the staff here at Hanover: Suzanne for her efficiency; Roxie for her great music selections for the choir and her gift of leadership as "music director"; Bev for the way she brings worship to our sanctuary through her organ music; and Melissa for keeping everything "in order" around the church. We have a very dedicated staff and I hope you thank each of them for their contributions especially as we moved through changes because of COVID-19.

As you can see with my statistical report, there has been no visiting in the hospitals when people have "procedures" in order to keep COVID or other diseases from spreading. I have also been calling those who have "sheltered at home" during these times in order to keep in touch. The good thing is that in these past months some people have allowed the "masked preacher" to visit in their homes. I think the pastoral presence has been important to those who otherwise have been isolated in their homes.

Not everything about COVID-19 has been negative and we will continue to analyze that over the next years. We have seen how wearing the masks has been a visual way we can care for others and many have certainly seen the benefit of increased hand washing to prevent the spread of germs. COVID-19 has also given us an opportunity to use our gifts to glorify the name of God. What gifts have been stirred within you as you reached out to others during this time? What new gift have you discovered you have?

Above all, let us remember that change is not all bad. It is just a signal of an identified need in response to present circumstances. Just think where we would be if we had never had the Wright Brothers take to the air or were still using coal oil lamps to light our houses in the dark of winter! The development of electricity brought so much change to our homes, to our businesses and to our world.

People coming together and using their intelligence for the "collective good" of God's people can certainly benefit many. Let us move forward, together!

- Maintenance activities were reduced during the past six months due to the pandemic disruption. Emphasis was placed on ensuring preventative hygiene measures such as placing hand sanitizers around the building and maintaining disinfection supplies.
- Emergency lighting improvement and exit signs placement are currently being addressed.
- Routine inspections of the fire extinguishers and elevator were paid for.
- Snow removal expenses ran over \$2800.
- A sign post holding two signs advertising our church and the Four Square Church (now called Emerge Hanover) was located at the northeast corner of Broadway and Wilson Ave. We are not sure when it was erected but feel it was over twenty five years ago. It held metal signs and was not constructed to meet current Penn Dot standards. This sign was severely damaged by a truck last year. Hanover Borough was consulted about putting the sign back up. A new stop sign has since been put up at the location where our sign was. There has been a higher than average amount of accidents at that location over the past several years. Placement of the signs in that area would reduce the sight vision of drivers pulling out onto Broadway. The other corners at that intersection would not be appropriate due to other obstacles. The Borough is planning to conduct a traffic study at that intersection and does not feel that a sign location in that area would be appropriate. The Church Board feels many people are using geographic information systems to find addresses today so it raises the question "is the sign needed?" The metal signs show their age. The post and anchor system would need to be rebuilt. The Church Board feels that we need to support public safety therefore a sign is not needed at that corner. A verbal explanation was given to some members of Emerge Hanover recently and an email explaining the situation has been sent to them. I have not had a response yet.

"Child Protection Committee" A Child Protection Policy

God is our refuge and our strength, our help in times of trouble. Psalms 46:1

Purpose:

Because God has placed into our care precious children Because each child is a blessing from God Because we hold that no child should suffer from abuse or neglect

We, the congregation of the Hanover Church of the Brethren, based on scripture and heritage, do establish this child protection policy to define the safeguards, policies and procedures for the protection of the children in our care.

He took a little child and had him stand among them. Taking the child in His arms, He said to them, "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me...Mark 9:36-37

"And if anyone causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to be thrown into the sea with a large millstone tied around his neck." Mark 9:42

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Matthew 19:14

Policies, Guidelines, and Procedures for Children/Youth Workers

Policies:

- 1. The Child Protection Committee policies, procedures and guidelines will be overseen by the Child Protection Committee. The *three (3) member* committee will consist of one representative from the Christian Education Commission, the Pastor and/or Moderator, and 2 members of the congregation approved by the Church Board. the chair of the Christian Education Commission, pastor or moderator, and a member of the congregation appointed by the church board for a three (3) year term. The Pastor or Moderator will chair any meetings involving allegations of abuse or neglect that are brought to the committee. The information discussed by the Child Protection Committee will be held in strict confidentiality. The minutes of the meetings will be confidential and only accessible to the committee members.
- 2. Children/Youth Workers should be active participants in our congregation for at least 6 months before serving as children and youth workers.
- 3. Children/Youth Workers must be adults. Teen Helpers may be as young as 13 but they must be under the supervision of the adult Children/Youth Worker and should not be left alone in charge of the children in their care. A Teen Helper may not take a

1

- child to the restroom. All Children/Youth Workers need to be at least four years older than the children or youth with whom they are working.
- 4. Children/Youth Workers will attend a training workshop annually which will cover the signs/symptoms of child abuse and review the Child Protection *Policy* Committee document. At that time they will sign a Children's Ministry Covenant. The covenants will be kept on file and valid for a year from the date of training.
- 5. Children/Youth Workers will be required to complete a *PA State Police* Request for Criminal Record Check and a Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance. *The church will underwrite the costs for processing the clearances for the Children/Youth Workers.* Once approved, the clearances will be kept in a confidential file in the Pastor's locked office. This file will only be accessible to the Pastor and to the Child Protection Committee members. *Clearances will need to be updated no later than five years after the date of certification. Failure to do so will result in temporary suspension as a Children/Youth Worker until completed.*
- 6. All Children/Youth Workers who moved into our area from out of Pennsylvania within the past ten years will need to provide us with a fingerprint based federal background check. child abuse clearance form their former state, in addition to the two clearances stated in #5 above. The cost of this check will be underwritten by the church.
- 7. The mandatory reporter of child abuse in a church setting is the pastor. All other employees or volunteers need to report their suspicions to the pastor. Any other person may report child abuse suspicions as a private citizen. The Child Protection Policy encourages persons working as Children/Youth Workers within the church, however, to go through the Child Protection Committee when making child abuse reports that are related to information the worker received as a Children/Youth Worker in the Hanover Church of the Brethren.
- 7. The Child Protection Committee *shall* will review the policy *every five years* annually and update it as needed.

Guidelines:

- 1. Diapering areas are to be in prominent view, not in a private, out-of-sight area. If this is not feasible, the parents will need to be contacted to do the diapering.
- 2. Two *non-related* Children/Youth Workers are preferred in a room. When only one is present an appointed volunteer or the Sunday School director will need to randomly check the room. *This also applies to youth group meetings*.
- 3. Paid staff is required to follow the same guidelines and policies as the volunteer Children/Youth Workers.
- 4. All doors and interior windows to classrooms/nurseries will have an unobstructed view into the room.
- 5. Nursery staff, nursing mothers, infants and their parents or guardians are the only ones permitted in the nursery during times when child care is being provided. An exception to this may be necessary when nursery staff have children of their own who are too young to sit unaccompanied in the sanctuary during the worship service.
- 6. Persons involved in the youth ministry (Grades 6-12) will comply with the "Southern

- PA District Church of the Brethren Guidelines for Advisor and Youth Interaction." Available from the Pastor.
- 7. Signed permission slips *and emergency contact forms* from parents/guardians must be secured for all overnight events and events held off church grounds.
- 8. The transportation of children or youth for off-site events must be provided by drivers who are at least 18 years of age. The vehicles used must have a working seat belt for each person. A copy of the driver's license and insurance card will need to be provided to the Child Protection Committee prior to the event.
- 9. If or when a child requests a private meeting, two Children/Youth Workers must be present, or the meeting will need to take place in public view.
- 10. Discipline must be "hands-off." Physical discipline must never be used. It is best in situations where discipline is necessary to use redirecting, reminding students of the Class Rules or Covenant, rewarding good behavior, removing the student from the classroom, or returning the student to their parent or guardian.
- 11. The Child Protection Committee will review the Child Protection Policy in a training workshop with teachers at least once a year, prior to the beginning of the Fall Sunday School quarter and prior to Vacation Bible School for the Bible School Volunteers. The Sunday School Director(s) and the Vacation Bible School Coordinator(s) must also attend the training.

Prcedures:

- 1. In the event of suspected child abuse or when an accusation has been reported to any member of the Child Protection Committee, a meeting will be called immediately (within 24 hours) comprised of the person who received the report, the Pastor and/or Moderator, and the reporter of the incident.
- 2. At least one male and one female are required to be present at the meeting.
- 3. The Pastor will serve as convener and will chair the meeting. The Moderator will serve as chair if the Pastor is unavailable.
- 4. The purpose of the meeting is to document the information utilizing the "Report of Suspected Incident of Child Abuse" form and, as deemed appropriate, to initiate the response plan.

Response Plan:

The Pastor and/or Moderator will:

- A. The Child Protection Committee shall follow-up on the report in the following way.
 - 1. Report to Southern Pennsylvania District Executive any suspected case of abuse by staff or volunteer worker in the church.
 - 2. Make appropriate phone call to Child Line 1-800-932-0313 or law enforcement agencies immediately and follow-up with a written report within 48 hours. Or submit an electronic report at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwls. No written report needs to be submitted if reported electronically.

3. Notify parents/guardians of alleged abuse, contingent upon advice from Child Line or law enforcement agencies.

B. If alleged abuser is a volunteer or paid staff of the church

- 1. Contingent on recommendations from law enforcement, alleged offender may be temporarily removed from position.
- 2. Pastor shall notify liability insurance company.
- 3. Depending on the outcome of the investigation of Child Line or law enforcement agencies, one of the following will occur:

a. If allegations are unsubstantiated:

- Every effort will be made to exonerate, reconcile and restore said member.
- A public statement by the Child Protection Committee will be made if said member so chooses.
- The Child Protection Committee will respond with love, care and concern to the complainant(s), to the congregation and to the accused and his/her family.

b. If allegations/investigations demonstrate poor judgment or unwise behavior but not abuse:

The Child Protection Committee will hold the offender responsible and accountable for this behavior.

- The person will be removed from serving with a vulnerable population for a period of 3 months to 2 years.
- Education and/or counseling will be required to correct the behavior.
- Reinstatement will be possible following approval by the Child Protection Committee.
- Actions taken will be communicated to the complainant(s) and congregation as necessary.

c. If allegations/investigations substantiate abuse:

• Ministry to the Victim:

- 1. Pastoral care and support will be offered.
- 2. A list of qualified resources and support services will be offered to the family, if requested.

• Ministry to the Offender:

- 1. Individual will be permanently removed from positions serving a vulnerable population.
- 2. Specialized counseling will be recommended.
- 3. Pastoral care and support will be continued for the offender and family during rehabilitation, if requested.

• Ministry to the Congregation:

1. The Child Protection Committee will confidentially report to the Executive Committee of the Church Board the results of the

- investigation.
- 2. With the help of the District, assistance will be available to the congregation to address concerns.
- Ministry to the Accused/Offender's Family:
 - 1. Pastoral care and support will be offered.
 - 2. A list of qualified resources and support services will be offered.

Definitions

Adult An individual who is 18 years of age or older.

Child Abuse Any recent act or failure to act that causes non-accidental serious physical injury or serious mental injury to a child under 18 years of age, or sexual abuse, or sexual exploitation of a child under 18. Child abuse also includes serious physical neglect constituting prolonged or repeated lack of supervision or failure to provide essentials of life, including adequate medical care, which endangers a child's life or development or impairs the child's functioning.

Child Someone who is not an adult.

Children/Youth Leaders Volunteer or paid staff that work with children or youth as teachers for Bible School, Sunday School, children or youth choir directors, youth advisors, leaders or teachers of other children/youth groups within the church.

Confidentiality (As related to the Child Protection Policy) All written or spoken information regarding the alleged child abuse incident will not be divulged by the members of the Child Protection Committee to any persons except those involved in the reporting and investigation of the alleged abuse.

Mandatory Reporter of Child Abuse Persons who, in the course of their employment, come in contact with children. Persons required to report child abuse include, but are not limited to, physicians, teachers, nurses, members of the clergy, day-care workers, who come in contact with children as part of their employment.

Victim The person against who abuse is committed.

Training Training related to child abuse and our Child Protection Policy will be held annually. The workshop will be lead by a person with experience in this area, such as a counselor, social worker or representative of a child abuse/child protection agency or law enforcement agency. The training will include, but not be limited to definitions of abuse, the prevalence in our area, causes and affects of abuse, and a focus on abusers' traits and characteristics. There will also be an explanation of the state laws and the requirements of the law that are placed on the church. It will also include a detailed explanation of our Child Protection Policy and an outline of the procedures under this policy. All Children/Youth Workers will need to attend to be updated at least once a year.
