From the Desk of Pastor Mark

"As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love." -John 15:9

Inward, outward, and upward!

There are three journeys we are all meant to take in a successful walk with Jesus. In some ways, we are always on these journeys, cycling through them as we grow deeper in our walk with Him.

The *inward* journey causes us to take a hard look at ourselves, to take a 'fearless moral inventory,' as recovering alcoholics like to say. An honest look in the mirror will lead us to see that we cannot save ourselves – that we are not going to make it without Jesus. We need rescued. This is the journey of repentance- not that we stop sinning, but that we admit we cannot stop sinning in our own strength, and throw ourselves on the mercy of God. And we need to repent daily- not to re-secure our salvation (for it is forever secure), but to remind us of our need for God and his incredible goodness toward us!

Once we have established our deep need for rescue, we look *upward* and find the Power that is greater than ourselves and that is strong enough to save us-namely Jesus Christ! We cry out to Him in our need and gratefully receive His grace. This is the journey of salvation, and also of worship! We lift up the Name of Jesus and the glory of God daily as we experience His love and grace through Jesus, and the grandeur of His creation!

The *outward* journey may sound self-explanatory. Once we take the honest look at ourselves that leads us to repentance; once we experience the truly good news of salvation in Jesus Christ, it simply falls to us to share that good news with others. The word *evangelist* simply means one who carries good news. If you are a saved Christian, then you carry good news! Now, it is important to remember that this is *not* a journey of wearing masks or hiding our continuing struggles, but rather an authentic journey of faith in which we allow people to see how we handle our struggles in Christ, not one in which we pretend we have none! "In this would you will have trouble," Jesus said, "But be of good cheer, for I have overcome the world." - John 16:33


