7th day of Lent – February 25th - So How Do I Begin? You have already begun. You have been taking time out of your day and begin this Lenten journey. Taking time out and changing your focus opens an opportunity for God to speak to you through the Holy Spirit. That is preparing you for appreciating all Christ has done for you. “Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.” 1 Thessalonians 5:18

8th day of Lent – February 26th - This is such a brief time, does it really count? Yes, without it your day can get so cluttered and chaotic that the whole day has passed with no connection. When we faithfully seek God, He is working even when we cannot see His hand at work. “Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.” Hebrews 11:1

9th day of Lent – February 27th – If God is so loving, why would He let His Son suffer and die? Jesus died for us willingly. That is how much we are loved. “You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God’s wrath through him!” Romans 5:6-9

10th day of Lent – February 28th – Why can’t I stop sinning like the good people? Jesus himself said that no one was good except God himself. When He took on humanity, He placed Himself in a vulnerable position, susceptible to temptation and sin. Though he never gave in to sin, His words wanted all to recognize that He was human in every way. “As Jesus started on his way, a man ran up to him and fell on his knees before him. “Good teacher,” he asked,

“What must I do to inherit eternal life?” “Why do you call me good?” Jesus answered. “No one is good—except God alone.” Mark 10:17-18

2nd Sunday during Lent – March 1st - “You, God, are my God, earnestly I seek you; I thirst for you, my whole being longs for you, in a dry and parched land where there is no water. I have seen you in the sanctuary and beheld your power and your glory. Because your love is better than life, my lips will glorify you. I will praise you as long as I live, and in your name, I will lift up my hands.” Psalm 63:1-4

11th day of Lent – March 2nd Going back to GOOD PEOPLE idea, weren’t the Jewish people God’s chosen people and therefore better than us Gentiles? Jesus became the equalizer for all who believe. No longer was there one chosen race. This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. Romans 3:22-24

12th day of Lent – March 3rd – How does Lent help us in our daily lives? A Pew Research Center’s survey found that 86% adults with strong faith felt a deeper sense of meaning and purpose, versus only 50% of those without a faith commitment. Lent’s focus is to help us get closer to God. “Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving. Colossians 3:23-24
