Phyllis Fuhrman has shared some special thoughts coming into this year's season of Lent. Though our daily readings will be brief, with questions answered to help us become more familiar with what the Lenten season is all about, Phyllis shares the following thoughts:

As we prepare our hearts this Lenten season before the celebration of Christ's resurrection, what do we think of? I know many people **GIVE UP** eating certain foods or other bad habits that they have acquired. I thought, "Why do we always have to **GIVE UP** something? Why don't we **GIVE OUT** more to other people, not only at this season, but all year long?" There are many things we can do. The power of prayer for the sick and shut-ins may work miracles in their lives. Have a needy family for a meal sometime. Send a card or call someone you haven't talked to in a while; it will brighten their day. Make a casserole or bake a pie for a neighbor who just came home from the hospital. Volunteer time at one of our local service organizations because they always need help. PAL lunches, Cross Keys Village, New Hope Ministries, Children's Aid Society are examples. Give a kind word to that person ahead of you in a long line; it will help you both be less impatient as you wait. How about taking an elderly neighbor or friend who no longer drives shopping? The list can go on and on; simple things where we can **GIVE OUT** to someone else. We know Christ **GAVE UP** His life for our eternal salvation. Why don't we **GIVE OUT** for Him? Read John:10-18
